We invest in initiatives that help create equity in communities, support education and workforce development, and protect and preserve the environment. Our shareholders contribute \$16 - \$18 million annually to strengthen the communities we serve. In 2024, they contributed \$1.2 million to non-profit partners in Texas.

## Helping build a more vibrant community

Volunteering is one of the most important ways Entergy employees power lives in our communities. In 2024, employees in Texas dedicated more than 16,000 hours of volunteer service valued at more than \$530,000.

## Investing in education

Entergy announced a 10-year, \$20 million commitment to elevate and empower Historically Black Colleges and Universities and their students across the company's service area in Arkansas, Louisiana, Mississippi and Texas. Through the expansion of Entergy's The Power of Prosperity program, the donation will support HBCUs and students with enhanced education, career readiness and workforce development programs.



## Helping customers beat the heat

The past two summers have brought record-level temperatures to Southeast Texas, which led to higher-than-usual electricity usage and higher costs on monthly bills. Entergy Texas is committed to helping our customers stay cool and save money this summer with bill management tools and customer assistance events.



## Free tax help for qualifying customers

For more than 15 years, Entergy Texas has provided free tax preparation help for low-to-moderate income customers. In 2024, Entergy Texas sponsored free tax help events at Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) sites throughout Southeast Texas. Customers received assistance from IRS-certified volunteers to help make the tax filing experience smooth and hassle-free.
